

Do you have a **LeakyLoo™**?



Leaking toilets are not always easy to spot as the water just dribbles away invisibly down the back of the pan. This could waste thousands of litres of water every year and, if you are on a water meter, could add to the cost of your bill.

To help you find out if your toilet has a leak, see reverse for how to use your **FREE LeakyLoo™ strip**.



It's so easy to use:

- Wait half an hour after the last flush
- Wipe the back of the pan dry with toilet tissue
- Peel back the adhesive cover on LeakyLoo™
- Place the strip horizontally across the back of the pan
- Keep the strip in place for three hours without the toilet being used
- Compare your strip with the images opposite to find out if you have a leak
- The strip will flush away when the toilet is next used

What to do if you find a leak

If you find a leak, it could indicate that your toilet may be defective and you may need to contact an approved plumber. More details on how to find approved plumbers are available on our website www.south-staffs-water.co.uk

Nothing to report?

If the strip remains unchanged, then your cistern is working normally and you don't need to do anything.

How to find out if you have a LeakyLoo™



Strip remains dry: Good news you don't have a leak.



LeakyLoo™ wording looks slightly blurred: You may have a small leak. Carry out regular checks to make sure it doesn't get any worse.



LeakyLoo™ strip starting to fall apart: You probably have a leak. Consider calling an approved plumber to get it fixed.



Strip breaks in two: It is likely you have a significant leak. Call an approved plumber to get it fixed.
